The Autism Care West organization places a strong emphasis on communication, social skills and fully incorporating families through education, training, and ongoing guidance to enhance the significant and meaningful changes it takes to improve lives. Autism Care West begins with a multimodal assessment that includes interview, self-report forms, direct observation across settings, and the Promoting Emergence of Advanced Knowledge (PEAK) assessment. Following the process, the results are carefully interpreted to create an individualized treatment plan that is uniquely tailored to the needs

of the child and family. Also included is parent education and family guidance, social skills group, and community-based instruction.

Nevada's Autism Treatment Assistance Program (ATAP) was created to assist parents and caregivers with the expensive cost of providing Autism-specific treatments to their child with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). ATAP is a statewide program that provides temporary assistance and funding to pay for evidenced-based treatment for children on the Autism Spectrum, who are under the age of 20 and are diagnosed as a person with autism spectrum disorder by a physician, psychologist, child/adolescent psychiatrist, pediatric neurologist, or other qualified professional. A diagnosis from a multidisciplinary team is acceptable when accompanied by an appropriate assessment report.
